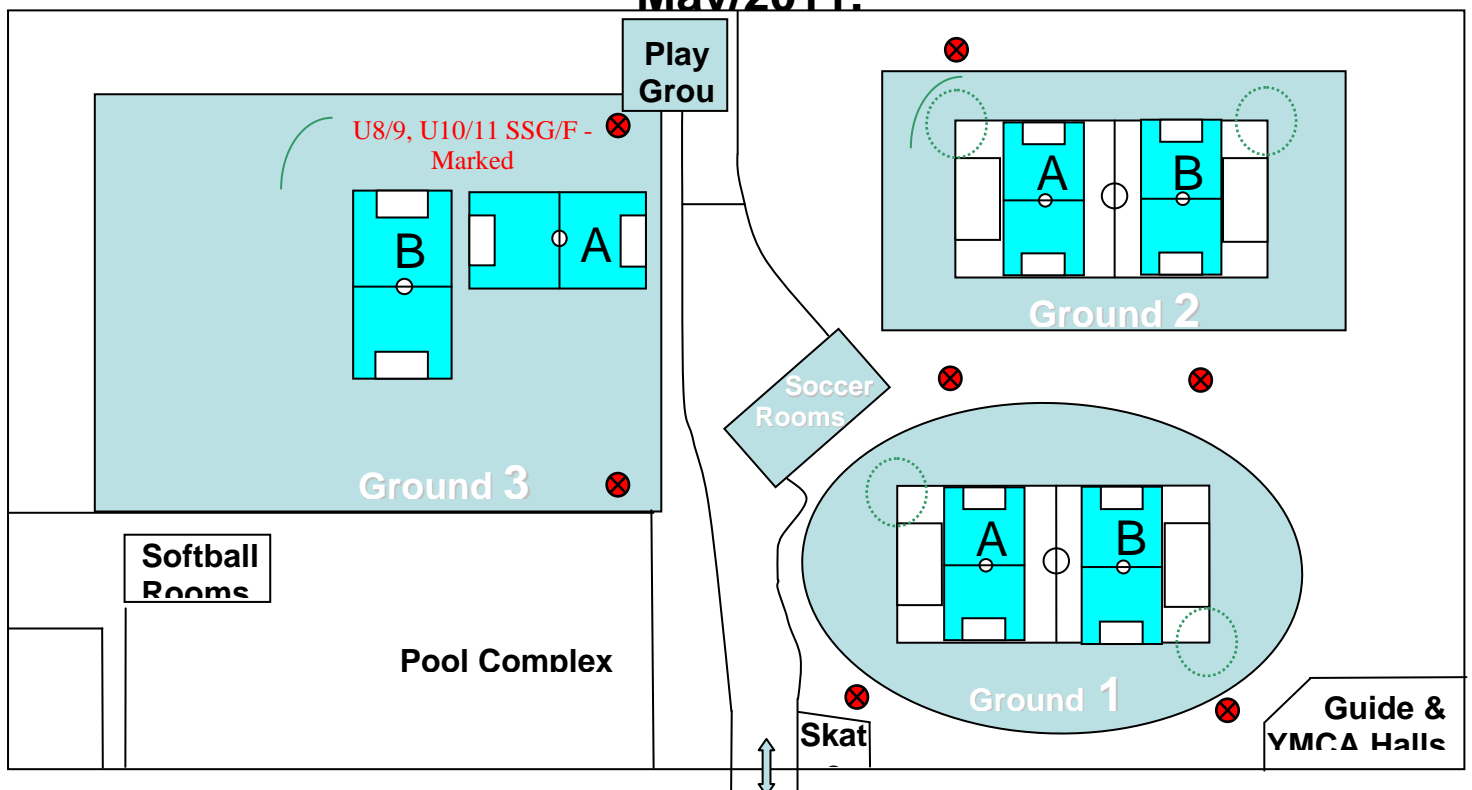

- 16 THE GOAL KICK
- 17 THE CORNER KICK

LAW 13 – FREE KICKS

Types of Free Kick

Free kicks are either direct or indirect.

The Direct Free Kick

Ball Enters the Goal

- if a direct free kick is kicked directly into the opponents' goal, a goal is awarded
- if a direct free kick is kicked directly into the team's own goal, a corner kick is awarded to the opposing team

The Indirect Free Kick

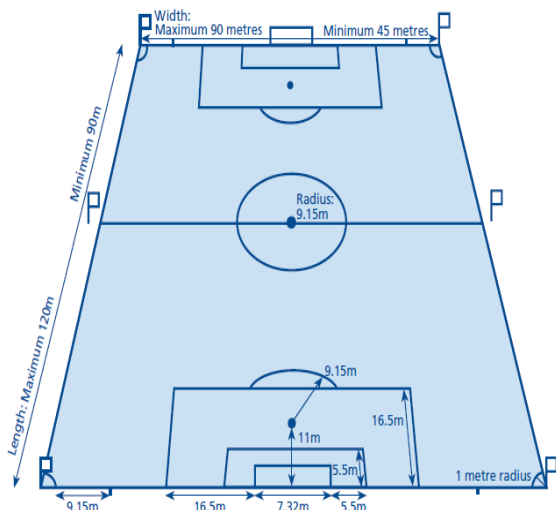
Signal

The referee indicates an indirect free kick by raising his arm above his head. He maintains his arm in that position until the kick has been taken and the ball has touched another player or goes out of play.

Ball Enters the Goal

A goal can be scored only if the ball subsequently touches another player before it enters the goal:

- if an indirect free kick is kicked directly into the opponents' goal, a goal kick is awarded
- if an indirect free kick is kicked directly into the team's own goal, a corner kick is awarded to the opposing team



LAW 12 – FOULS & MISCONDUCT (part only)

A direct free kick is awarded to the opposing team if a player commits any of the following offences:

- holds an opponent
- handles the ball deliberately (except for the goalkeeper within his own penalty area)

Definition of “Handling the ball”

Handling the ball involves a deliberate act of a player making contact with the ball with his **hand or arm**. The referee must take the following into consideration:

- the movement of the hand towards the ball (not the ball towards the hand)
- the distance between the opponent and the ball (unexpected ball)
- the position of the hand does not necessarily mean that there is an infringement
- touching the ball with an object held in the hand (clothing, shin guard etc.) counts as an infringement
- hitting the ball with a thrown object (boot, shin guard etc.) counts as an infringement.

You make up your own mind about Harry's defensive during the World Cup.

Note:- Girls can bring their arms up to protect their chests, but can't use them to push the ball away.

LAW 9 - Ball in and out of Play

The ball is out of play when:

- it has wholly crossed the goal line or touch line whether on the ground or in the air
- play has been stopped by the referee **The ball is in play** at all other times, including when:
 - it rebounds from a goalpost, crossbar or corner flag post and remains in the field of play
 - it rebounds from either the referee or an assistant referee when they are on the field of play

LAW 1 - The Field of Play – see diagram left

Field surface - Matches may be played on natural or artificial surfaces, according to the rules of the competition.

Dimensions - The field of play must be rectangular. The length of the touch line must be greater than the length of the goal line.

Length: min. 90 m to max. 120 m

Width: min. 45 m to max. 90 m

International Matches

Length: min. 100 m to max. 110 m

Width: min. 64 m to max. 75 m

As the game developed in the UK, all key dimensions relate back to imperial dimensions eg 9.15 m = 10 yards.

Goal Mouth - The distance between the posts is 7.32 m (8 yds) and the distance from the lower edge of the crossbar to the ground is 2.44 m (8 ft).
